#### Context

- 1] Jacob and his 12 sons, including Joseph, went to Egypt where they became a great nation (c 1 m),
- 2] over 400 years they were enslaved by Pharaoh.
- 2] Moses then led them out towards the promised land and God gave them His Law at Sinai.
- 3] The people rebelled against Him and that generation died during 40 years in the wilderness.
- 4] Moses led them back to the edge of the promised land and gave them a copy of the Law
- 5] Here Moses speaks about God's leadership in His Kingdom; the promised land.

#### The principle - justice (16:18-20)

- 1] Appoint people as righteous judges. (18)
- 2] Don't pervert justice (19)

Nb meaning of justice (heb 'mishpat')

- a) punishing all wrong doers regardless of race social status etc
- b) give people their rights esp widows orphans immigrants and the poor nb don't be greedy On BBC last week, Dawn Bilborough a critical care nurse came off an extended shift and found 'empty shelves. Weeping, she begged the public; 'just take what you need'

3] Justice only justice ---

Nb justice justice

Cf Be holy as I am holy (Lev 11:44; 1 Pet 1:16) (cf Be perfect ... (Mt 5:58)

4] Inherit land God is giving you

Nb inherit – not something that you have earned but that God has promised) cf Eph 2:8,9)

GRACE The Lord gives towns and land

# The aim – purge the evil from your midst (16:21- 17:8)

1] God forbids (16:21-7:1)

a) No Asherah pillars (16:21)

Nb feminine Canaan goddess

Nb Pillar speaks of worship of pillar of cloud by day and fire by night in wildness (Ex 13:21)

Cf 10 commandments 1&2 – Have no other Gods before me & do not make idols (5:7,8)

\*The Lord hates idol worship\*

\*Do not try and worship anyone alongside God. \*

b) A blemished sacrifice = an abomination (17:1)

Cf abomination = the Canaanites practices eg sacrifice children (12:31)

ie blemished sacrifice means keep the best one for yourselves

Nb God will not accept 1/2 hearted worship

\*Lord counts an inferior offering as (worse than?) none — abominable\*

\*Do not try and 'shortchange' God - better do nothing? \*

2] If evil /transgression of God's covenant found among you (7:2-7)

a) diligent (be careful) investigating an abomination (an offense to the Lord) (2-4)

\*The Lord counts it as evil to transgress his covenant\*

\*If involved in an accusation enquire diligently, act collaboratively and take responsibility. \*

b) stone the man or woman to death (5)

cf stoning at city gate Stephen (Acts 7:58); Jesus – (Hebrews 13:12)

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c) witnesses / accusers (6,7)
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1) 2 or 3 (6)

Ie more than 1 cf Jesus' instruction - two or three witnesses (Matt 18:16)

2) Witness throw the first stone (7)

Ie it is a grave and personal responsibility to accuse another – be very careful

Cf Jesus - those without sin cast the first stone (John 8:7)

\*Purge evil from your midst. \*

## The authority – God / his priests (17:8-13)

1] A situation / case too difficult for you – take it to Lord / His chosen place (8)

Cf Decision too difficult for you – work, family, relationship - 'take it to the Lord in prayer''.

Dang Xio Ping, Donald Trump, Vladimir Putin vs coronavirus! (a sub mic, non-living, lump of chemical

2] Come to Priest / Levites – (Lord's 'go betweens') (9,10)

Nb we have a great High priest Jesus (Heb 4:14; 10:11)

\*GRACE The Lord chooses how He is worshipped\*

3] Act according to their ruling (11,12)

? Harsh? God the Son - crucified - "Father forgive them as they don't know what they are doing" (Lk 23:34)

\*The Lord considers dishonouring his priest as a capital offence (nb NOT church leader) \*

4] All the people shall hear and fear and not act presumptuously again (13)

\*Fear acting presumptuously before the Lord your God\*

## The fulfilment (17:14-20)

1] When in the land 'I will set a king over me" ... The Lord "you may indeed" (14, 15a) ! presumptuously!

Cf a king like all the nations around me (1 Sam 8:5)

\*Be careful – the Lord may give you what you ask for\*

2] The Lord stipulations (15b

a) a brother – not a foreigner(15b)

nb Herod the Great (Mt 2:3) was a Jew by religion but an Edomite by descent

cf'... your king' – (of line of David) --- we have no king but Caesar (In 19:15)

b) not many horses, wives, excessive gold (16, 17a, 17b)

cf Solomon, David's son - 666 talent of Gold pa, 700 wives, 12k horsemen (1 Kings 10:26-29 11:1-8)

c) On the throne of his kingdom (ie when he rules) (18-20)

1) devoted to / obedient to 'this Law' - fear the Lord. (18,19)

Cf Fear of the Lord is the beginning of Wisdom (Prov 1:7)

Cf It is written ...' The final Word when Jesus tempted by the Devil (Lk 4:4,8,10)

Nb You are my beloved son with whom I am well pleased (Lk 3:22)

2) his heart (mind) not be lifted up above his brothers (20a)

Nb Hebrew the heart was the centre of the mind

CfJESUS, humble, though equal to God – humbled himself, became nothing, took on the form of a servant (Phil 2:8)

3) Obedient – not turning aside to the right or left. (20b)

Cf JESUS The son can do nothing of his own accord but only what he sees His Father doing (Jn5:19) \*JESUS was such a devoted, faithful, obedient King\*

#### Conclusion

- 1] acknowledge the Lord's justice He is in charge.
- 2] If you do this be thankful -

Nb even sinful stupidity He uses for good for those who love him and are called according to his purpose (Rmns 8:28)

MP Obey and apply God's justice alone in your inheritance

**KV** Justice and only justice you shall follow, that you may live and inherit the land that the Lord your God is giving you (16:20)
