Context

- 1] Joseph's brothers had agreed to murder him (37:18)
- 2] Judah, with profit in mind, had them sell him into slavery in Egypt (37:25, 26)
- 3] After leading their father to believe Joseph was dead, he permanently mourned (37:31-35)

Judah's Flight (1)

- 1] At that time 'father in permanent mourning' (37:35)
- 2] left brothers, 'went down' to stay with man of Adullam, Hirah (Canaanite)

Nb 'went down' lit 'turn aside' usually moral choice - deviating from loyalty/righteousness Nb Adullam SW of Jerusalem. Will be Judah's after the conquest of Canaan (cf 2 Chronicles 11:5,7).

Cf running away? (Ps 139:7ff; Jonah 1:3)

Nb Bad company corrupts good character' (1 Cor 15:33)

God permits His children to do wrong /go the wrong way

Do not run and avoid God / difficulties - do your God's will

Judah's Family (2-11)

1] met ...married...lay with...pregnant – Son (Er) (3) cf. Esau marries a pagan wife (28:1ff) *right thing at wrong time / situation = the wrong thing*

2] repeated -2 sons, (Onan and Shelah) (4,5)

Nb 'Kezib' where Shelah was born, related to Hebrew – 'to tell a lie'

3] Er and Onan 'wicked in God's sight .. the Lord put him to death' (6-10)

Nb Onan's wickedness = not fulfilling Levirate marriage (Deuteronomy 25:5-6)

Cf wages of sin are death (Rmns 3:23) Lord put him to death cf (1 Cor 11:29,30)Breathed life into man (Gen 2:7)

God deals / will deal with wickedness

Do not seek to avoid your responsibilities before God

4] Judah 'protects' Shelah - puts child before God (11)

Cf Boaz seeking the closest relative to Ruth (Ruth 3:9)

Cf Abraham and Isaac (22:1-14), The Father and Jesus (Jn 3:16)

by God's grace, put Him first *Face up to your challenges under God* *Do not rationalise disobeying God*

Judah's Fancy' (12 -14)

1] Wife dies – grief – then 'sheep shearing' with Hiram the Adullamite (12a)

Nb sheep shearing related to Canaanite fertility cult – sex & prostitution

Cf Warning of the Prophets (Jer 2:20ff; 3:1ff; Ez 23::37-45; Hosea 2:2-5)

*Beware the temptation that thinks that weakness can justify / earn the right to sin'

2] J. to Timnah – on boundary of land given to Judah (12b)

beware the boundaries of God's promise

- 3] Tamar (13, 14)
 - a) told his Father 'on way to shear sheep' sexual licence
 - b) covered head with veil cf a prostitute
 - c) reason Shelah had not been given her as wife

Allow your actions to be guided by the spirit (cf 26)

Judah's Foolishness (15-23)

- 1] Approached her thinking she was a prostitute (15,16a)
- 2] Tamar what will you give me? (16b)
- 3] The deal (17,18a) = Judah a young goat. Tamar a pledge? J what like? T your seal, cord and staff. (unmistakeable sign of id)

Nb the Lord must have directed her path – what ifnot approached, no pledge, other offer, no sign?

Trust in the Lord --- He will direct your paths

4] The transaction (18b, 19) – gave them to her, slept with her and she became pregnant.

Nb took off veil put on clothes – solely for this action

5] Judah sent a goat with Hiram Adullamite for the 'shrine prostitute' (19-21)

Don't get others to do your dirty work!

6] No sign – No action = a laughing stock? (22, 23)

Nb admission of guilt

Judah's Folly (24, 25)

1] 3 months later – pregnant. cf Mary stayed with cousin Elizabeth (Lk 1:56)

2] Judah - 'guilty of prostitution' (24a)

I.e. no indication of betrothal?

3] 'burned to death (24b)

Nb Take out the spec in your own eye first (Luke 6:41, 42)

Look at your own sin before condemning others

4] The pledge returned (25)

Cf your sins will find you out (Nu 32:23) Nathan to David - You are the man (2 Sam12:7)

Be sure that your sins shall find you out

Judah's Future (26-30)

1] The issue = $unrighteousness\ before\ God$

Nb r = a blameless state before God brought about by faith (15:6)

The marginalised 'foreigner' Tamar was the righteous one cf JESUS

2] Repentance (26b)

Nb Admitting sin (cf 2 Sam 12:13) ie didn't sleep with her again

GRACE He allows repentance after sin - Repent of your unrighteousness.

3] The heir (27-30)

Nb twins in womb cf His Grandfather and gt Uncle (Jacob and Esau) were twins (25:22) Nb as with Judah's repentance – the birth was a struggle but the Lord's will was done *Don't presume – wait till the end to determine God's will*

MP A recognition of our unrighteousness is the first indication of repentance

KV "She is more righteous than I.... and he did not sleep with her again" (26)

Conclusion

- 1] Timing Events in ch 38 may have taken c **20 yrs** +. Meantime, Joseph was 17 at start, (37:2), 30 when he became prime minister (41:46), 37 when the 7 years of famine started **20 yrs!!!**
- 2] Judah a) 4th Son of 1st wife Leah name means 'praise' (29:35) b) Leader i) J sold into

Egypt (37:27) ii) spokesman for bros. (43:1ff; 44:10ff) iii) Repentant - offered self for brother (44:33,44), c) Blessed by Jacob – lion of Judah (49:9)

3] This chapter 'interjected'? - Judah, the line of Messiah, must be brought to repentance before he re-engages with the story of his people's deliverance to Egypt.
